Artist of the month is a competition that runs in school. This month's artist is: **Joseph Wright of Derby** – Born in Derby in 1734, Wright is an internationally renowned artist, whose paintings and works on paper adorn the walls of major galleries the world over.

Joseph Wright (1734–1797), was an English landscape and portrait painter from Derby, England. He was one of the first major English painters to have his career established outside of London and is known for his paintings of candlelit scenes and scientific and industrial subjects. He has been acclaimed as "the first professional painter to express the spirit of the Industrial Revolution".

Wright is notable for his use of **tenebrism effect**, which emphasizes the contrast of light and dark, and, for his paintings of candle-lit subjects. Joseph Wright wanted to share the developments in science and greater understanding and wonder of how the world worked to his audience.

This month can you show light and shadow in your artwork? Whatever the position of the light source shining on an object, there will be direct light and reflected light which will affect the shadows and highlights on the object. There are several different techniques of shading – hatching, cross-hatching, stumping and stippling which can be used to show light and shadow in drawing.

This month why not create a piece of artwork inspired by Joseph Wright or by some of the other artists where light was important. Take a closer look in the Artist of the Month book for more inspiration. I look forward to seeing your creations.
