<b>Curriculum Provision</b>	<p>Charanga music scheme is used to teach music across the whole school. Lessons are timetabled and take place each week.</p> <p>The scheme offers clear progression of skills and knowledge. This scheme has been very successful in supporting the delivery of the National Curriculum, teacher workload and CPD needs of staff in these areas. Subject leader monitoring shows the Kapow scheme is used successfully by all staff to facilitate children learning and remembering more.
